

Toyota has added features to its flagship LandCruiser 200 Series. The 200 will now come standard with a 45-litre sub-tank in addition to the main 93-litre fuel tank and a 12-volt rear accessory socket, which were glaring omissions when the vehicle was launched.



Entry-level LandCruiser 200 Series GXL has a new driver's seat with mechanical height and power lumbar adjustments.

Every 200 will now have a rear-view camera; 'crawl' technology for negotiating tough off-road situations; audio controls on the steering wheel; a 3.5mm audio input jack and a USB port allowing full iPod control.

Crawl is a 'feet-off' control system that assists the driver in handling rocky terrain, moguls, rubble, snow, mud, gravel and sand.

A moon roof is now standard on all VX and Sahara variants.
